FEES:

A fee of \$155 for the first child, \$135 for each extra child in the family (this fee only allows for one horse per rider). An extra horse fee of \$20 per week will be charged for each additional horse. Camp fees include all meals for the child, instruction costs and showground hire costs. (All Horse feed to be supplied by owners).

There is a special day rate for children under 10 and Associates riders of \$25 per day (if these riders do not wish to stay overnight). The \$25 fee includes lunch.

DAY RIDERS TO BRING PLATE, MUG, KNIFE, FORK, SPOON AND TEA TOWEL.

All entry forms with payment, including a \$75 incentive fee for workers (see below), is to be received by our Camp Secretary, Stephanie McKinnon, PO Box 604, WAUCHOPE, 2446. (the closing date is 31st August, 2014). All Cheques are to be made payable to the Hastings District Pony Club or direct deposit to BSB 032 589 Account: 460 232 (contact name details to be included)

RULES:

ALL HORSES MUST BE HENDRA VACCINATED WITH CURRENT CERTIFICATE AND WILL BE SCANNED. All entrants must be current financial year members of the Pony Club Association of NSW to attend camp. Please contact our club Secretary Joan Barnes at Saddleworld, to become a member if you do not hold a current membership. Or it will be possible to sign up on the first day of camp.

To ensure the efficient running of the camp bad behavior will not be tolerated and may result in an expulsion with no refund.

This camp is run on a voluntary basis and to ensure the smooth running of camp all parents are required to complete a work roster of at least three duties, per child attending, over the duration of camp (no more than 6 six shifts will be allocated to any one family).

A refundable incentive fee of \$75 will be charged (per family) which will be refunded on the last day of camp if all the duties allocated have been completed. Please include a separate cheque or include in your direct deposit with your camp payment.

YOUR CHILD WILL NEED

UTILITIES: Bed & bedding, toiletries, torch, bath towel, eating utensils – dinner plate, bowl, mug, knife, fork & spoon and **tea towel** in a suitable bag (a library bag is ideal).

SADDLERY: Ordinary bridle, saddle with double buckle girth or girth and surcingle, halter and lead, saddlecloth, grooming and cleaning gear. Shovel, rake, rubber gloves and wheelbarrow for cleaning stables. Don't forget ring stoppers on reins for rings.

HORSES: All saddles & bridles will be kept in the allocated locked shed at night – no saddlery is to be kept in the dorms or stables.

FEEDING HORSES: It is the responsibility of **parents** to supply feed for their horses. It is recommended two weeks prior to camp that all horses are introduced to a full feed ration as your horse(s) need to become familiar to this diet for the duration of camp.

CLOTHES: Approved riding hat and boots, jodhpurs, jeans and shirts (with collar & short or long sleeves) warm clothing. Rubber boots and a raincoat. Joggers for games.
NO SINGLET TOPS ALLOWED
All belongings MUST be clearly labeled with your child's name.

ALL CHILDREN: To bring sunscreen, band-aids and lip moisturizer. Medicines should be left with the Camp official with child's name clearly written on them with clear instructions on times and quantities to be taken.

WE HAVE DECIDED TO HAVE A HAWAIIAN DAY WHERE THE KIDS AND THEIR HORSES GET TO DRESS UP & RIDE IN THESE OUTFITS FOR THE DAY. PLEASE PACK APPROPRIATE GEAR. (CHEAP HAWAIIAN SHIRTS CAN BE FOUND AT THE SECOND HAND CLOTHES SHOPS) PRIZE FOR THE BEST DRESSED.

COULD EVERY FAMILY PLEASE BRING IN A 2L BOTTLE OF CORDIAL AND A COUPLE PACKETS OF BISCUITS / CAKES / SLICES OR LOTS OF FRUIT TO BE SERVED AT MORNING & AFTERNOON TEAS. ANY OTHER DONATIONS WOULD BE GREATLY APPRECIATED.

SOME CAMP RULES

1. No Mobile phones are to be used while children are in horse or instructional areas. We would prefer all phones to be left at home.
2. Children Under 7 years of age must go home at night to sleep, unless a parent stays with them – keeping in mind that there is a girl's dorm and boy's dorm.
3. Once camp has commenced children are only permitted to leave in the company of a parent/guardian after they have been signed out and the camp official is notified.
4. All people at Camp, including Instructors, Camp Mums and Dads or general helpers using the dining room facilities are to wash their own plates and utensils after use.
5. Parents are asked to note that the dormitories and kitchen must be cleaned out and all bedding and gear collected prior to the final Troop drill, which should commence at about 9.00am. We will not commence until this work is finished, therefore, the more parents that offer to help clear these general areas, the earlier we can get underway.
6. Meals are available to the instructors, camp mums, camp dads and workers rostered on, and a meal ticket will be issued to them. All other guests may purchase meal tickets at a cost of \$7 per meal for breakfast and lunch and \$9 for dinner. A **NO TICKET NO MEAL** rule will apply.
7. There is a fee payable to the Wauchope Show Society for Caravans or people sleeping in horse floats, horse trucks camped on the Showground during Camp of \$20 per night. Please contact the Show Secretary, on 02 6585 3023 to arrange for payment of this fee, if applicable.
8. Adults & Parents in attendance at the Camp are asked to respect the Pony Club Alcohol Policy and refrain from drinking alcohol whilst camp is underway during the day. Discretion please of an evening. Camp Parents should not drink alcohol whilst the children are under their care. The Club reserve the right to police this Policy if it is seen to be abused in any way.
9. Please tell your children that their **horse must be fed, watered and stables cleaned before the child Has their breakfast.**

PROGRAM FOR FIRST DAY OF CAMP

SUNDAY 21ST SEPTEMBER 2014

Children may only ride inside the ring with full equipment. Horses must be led if outside the ring. Children are to wear helmets at all times whilst in and around the stable areas.

Prior to 2.00pm:

Clean stables and fill with fresh sawdust (make sure manure is dumped in trailer provided). Put in feed and water bins. The stallion stalls are for under 10 children only. The Senior Instructor will allocate other stalls in troops.

Meeting at 2.00pm:

All parents and children are to attend a meeting at 2.00pm (sharp) outside the kitchen.

2.30pm:

Children should lead their saddled horses to the main gate and into the show ring for gear check, hendra vaccination check, horses scanned and placement into riding groups. Parents must clean out dormitories and dining room before bringing in bedding. Fathers will be needed to carry jump wings and poles into ring, set up jumps, dressage, and tiny tot's arenas.

Parents are asked to be present until their child has passed an inspection of horse, hendra vaccination check, horse scanning, helmet and saddlery items. *If gear does not pass gear check, child may be unable to ride until parents replace or adjust unsuitable equipment.*

PROGRAM FOR THURSDAY 25TH SEPTEMBER 2014

Troop Drill and a small Gymkhana will be held on this day. Awards will be given after all pony club equipment is packed up and taken back to pony club grounds. **HELPERS REQUIRED!!!** The camp will officially finish at approximately 3.00pm Thursday - nothing will be provided by the Pony Club after Lunch.

Parents and children must clean out dormitories before the start of troop Drill at 9.00am. The parents are responsible to see that their child's stable is properly cleaned before they leave the grounds.

Uniform for the Troop Drill and Gymkhana is beige/fawn jodhpurs/riding pants and club pony club polo shirt (Royal Blue/Red collared shirt for Hastings members)

If you are not able to help for ***at least 3 sessions during the week***, your incentive cheque or deposit of \$75 per family will not be refunded.

KITCHEN

Mums, Dads, (Aunts, Uncles, Brothers, Sisters or Grandparents – even neighbour's) are needed here! The Kitchen has a number of work sessions:

6.00am to 9.30am	(Flexible for working parents) Preparing breakfast, serving & cleaning-up BREAKFAST IS SERVED FROM 7.30 AM
10am to 10.30am	<i>Morning Tea helpers required</i>
9.30am to 1.30pm	Preparing lunch, serving and cleaning-up LUNCH IS SERVED FROM 12.00 NOON
1.30pm to 5.30pm	Preparing Dinner
2.45pm to 3.15pm	<i>Afternoon Tea helpers required</i>
5.30pm to finish	Serving dinner & cleaning up DINNER IS SERVED FROM 6.00 PM
Please note:	All meals are prepared by volunteers, such as yourselves. Children wash-up their own cutlery, cups & plates. Kitchen helpers do not wash-up for others and are only responsible for the cooking utensils.

CLEANING/CLEANUP DUTIES

All parents of the members of Hastings Pony Club are required to help on the final day with cleanup. Many hands make light work. The dormitories will need to be swept. The Kitchen will need to be swept and mopped. All the equipment belonging to Hastings District Pony Club will need to be returned to the pony club grounds.

All stables and stable areas will need to be left clean and tidy. It is the responsibility of the person using each stable to ensure that it is left in a clean and tidy manner. This will be taken into consideration when refunding your \$75 incentive fee.

It is the responsibility of the parent(s) to care for their child and their child's pony, it is expected that there will be one parent present to carry out all duties listed below.

3.30pm to 4.30pm	FOURTH RIDING SESSION
4.30pm	U10 children to unsaddle their pony, check stable & water, rug and feed etc.

Please note - As you can see quite a lot of work is involved in the everyday care of your child's pony. On the "Parent's Roster Form" if you foresee difficulty caring for your child's pony could you please specify on you application form, as volunteers will have to be organised for these duties.

Unless advised on the application form, it will be assumed that you will be there to carry out the duties listed above.

Associate and U10 riders paying the day rate may leave their pony/horse at the grounds, if necessary. The pony or horse **must** be cared for by a parent or family member.

PLEASE NOTE THAT THE DAY FEE DOES NOT INCLUDE PARENT'S MEALS. MEALS CAN BE PURCHASED.
